## What is a "Limited Admission" Shelter?

Many people ask what is the difference between a "limited admission" shelter, a "no-kill" shelter or an "open admission shelter". In a limited admission shelter such as Cat Care Society, cats can be euthanized if a cat is terminally ill, psychologically unsuitable for shelter life, tested positive for FIV (Feline Immunodeficiency Virus) or FeLV (Feline Leukemia Virus) or a dangerously aggressive cat. A "no-kill" shelter does not believe in euthanizing, even if the cat is extremely sick. An "open admission" shelter will euthanize based on population control. In other words, a limited admission shelter can only take in a specific amount of animals, because of space issues, while an "open admission" shelter generally does not turn away any relinquished animals.

### CCS's euthanasia policy reads:

"Cats testing positive for FIV or FeLV will be euthanized as soon as possible after testing positive. Cats who are terminally ill, psychologically unsuitable for shelter life, or dangerously aggressive will be euthanized.

There will be cats that enter the shelter and show aggressive behavior towards people. This is understandable behavior for any cat coming into a strange environment. CCS will take steps necessary to help the cat cope with living in a shelter environment. However, any cat that has consistently shown aggressive behavior towards people and has bitten three times or has been excessively aggressive towards other cats will be euthanized. This is for the safety of the staff, general public and shelter cats, in addition to liability issues." 🐾

# A Favorite Adoption Story

Kody was found by a family in their back yard. He was emaciated and very hungry. They took him to a veterinarian and spent \$200 to try and find out if he was okay. When they found out Kody had kidney disease, they could not afford the treatment necessary for him. That's when they called Cat Care Society! Kody only weighed 5 pounds and his size made him to appear a very young cat. However, after closer examination, he has to be at least 12 years old or older!

In addition to needing fluids every day, Kody wasn't eating well. We force fed him at first, but after three days, he started eating on his own. Kody was introduced to the hallway at the shelter and soon found his way into the kitchen where he could sleep undisturbed, but very close to the food. He was spoiled, because every time a staff member went into the kitchen, Kody would get up and tell us he was hungry. And, of course, we fed him. By the time he was adopted, 2 months later, he had gained 2 pounds!

Kody was adopted by two young women with a cat and two dogs. He is very well loved by his new family. The latest update explains, "He has proven himself very interested in toys, yet has trouble understanding them at times. We have constructed a puffy ball toy gadget that is attached to a string which hangs from the ceiling that he

absolutely loves. He actually jumps off the bed and attacks it. He is adorable, sweet and very easy going. He is also infatuated with q-tips.

Kody is still very chatty around 3 am, but just needs to be held and then he returns to his bed. Our other cat, Fledermouse is coming around and they have even sat at opposite ends of the couch during a movie, with no hassling. Mouse is still coming to terms with Kody's presence and can be super sweet to him or run away crying when she sees him. They have a love-hate thing going on.

When Kody cries, he has four different types of inflection: the *wet food cry* and the *dry food cry*, the *I-don't-know-where-I-am cry* and his *just-give-me-love-cry* — all of which are very distinctive and identifiable no matter where he is."

Cat Care Society is grateful for the two young women for taking an elderly cat with health issues. Kody is doing so well; he has not needed any additional fluid treatment for his renal failure. As you can see, cats at any age can be affectionate, funny and adorable. Kody has truly been blessed with a wonderful life-long family. 🐾

## CCS CORPORATE SPONSOR: Tagawa Gardens

---

*This is the second in our series featuring some of our Business Partners. If you are in the area, please stop by Tagawa Gardens, it is a fantastic place!*

Tagawa Gardens opened its door to the community 26 years ago. However, the greenhouses at 7711 S. Parker Road have an even longer history in the local area. Built in the early 1960's, throughout the years they supplied the local area with tomatoes, fresh cut carnations and long-stem roses. The Tagawa family purchased these greenhouses in 1976 and quietly continued to grow beautiful roses. The 1982 Christmas Blizzard crushed many of the greenhouses and the family decided to take the opportunity to change the course of the greenhouse's history. When the greenhouses were rebuilt, Tagawa Gardens was introduced to the local community as a garden center.

Things were very different in those first years. Only 5000 square feet of the greenhouse was open to the public. In 2008, there are 110,000 sq. ft., with 50,000 sq. ft. dedicated to growing plants and over an acre of outdoor nursery. Four coworkers ran the shop in 1982. In 2008, there are over 40 year round employees and up to 130 seasonally. In 1982, it was a very relaxed and slow-paced time, very reflective of the growth and economy of the region. Recent years have brought more people to the local community as they discovered the beauty of the south Arapahoe/Douglas County area and made it their home. This growth has helped Tagawa's mature into what it has become today—a gathering place to provide plants, flowers, other gardening supplies, education and community events.

Visitors to Tagawa's can sip complimentary herbal tea and stroll through acres of an indoor and outdoor oasis of lush plants, blooming display gardens and gather ideas for home, garden and patio. They can enjoy leisurely chats with garden enthusiasts and experts. Tagawa's provides an extensive, year-round schedule of garden and environment-related classes; fun family events; musical entertainment; cultural and arts demonstrations; special tours and lectures for local schools and other community organizations; and a friendly, knowledgeable and experienced staff.

Each staff member takes much care to provide the best and newest plants and products available. A family feeling

amongst the employees is pervasive and carries over to the relaxed, warm, friendly and comfortable atmosphere found at Tagawa Gardens. The Tagawa Gardens vision statement is *“to provide for our community the highest quality service, product and education, and along with this commitment, respect for our environment.”*

Tagawa Gardens was honored to receive the *Top Garden Center Award for 2006/7* by The Rocky Mountain News and voted *Best Garden Center* by the 7News A-list and was recently voted one of the Top 100 Revolutionary Garden Centers by a national trade magazine. Tagawa Gardens is also nominated for the “Innovator Award” by the Colorado Business in the Arts Committee, for Tagawa's unique use of the arts in their marketing and community events.

Tagawa's “Grey Kitty Tradition” began in 1986 with the adoption of a very handsome, friendly Russian Blue mix cat that was found near the home of an employee. He soon won all of the employees' hearts (including customers and their children's) with his mellow, happy, friendly demeanor. His “special comments” to customers and his photo began appearing in Tagawa's advertising, and the rest is history.

Grey Kitty 1 was lost to cancer in 1990. Grey Kitty 2 came to Tagawa's with the help of the Denver Dumb Friends League. Kitty 2 was mellow, peaceful and quiet, and lived at Tagawa Gardens for 10 years, where he lived a happy life of visiting with customers, children and being spoiled by employees. When he was adopted, he had medical issues, however he received excellent care from his team of veterinarians, as well as super-attentive employees. He passed away at 16 in 2000. The Dumb Friends League helped find Grey Kitty 3, who was extremely mellow. He mysteriously disappeared from the store during the day of June 9, 2002.

Grey Kitty 4 and 5 are the current mascots. Grey 4 (“Fuzzy Grey”) was adopted from Max Fund, which found a tiny grey kitty alone on the Denver city streets. They knew Tagawa's were Grey Kitty-less and kindly and generously provided this kitty to Tagawa Gardens.

Grey 5 (“Smoky Grey”) was adopted from the Dumb Friends League Adoption Van when they visited Tagawa's

at their 20th Anniversary Party in August of 2002. Amazingly enough, Grey Kitty 5's birth date was the exact date that Grey Kitty 2 passed away...

Currently, both Grey Kitty 4 and 5 are "on holiday" at Mr. Tagawa's home as the area surrounding Tagawa Gardens, which was previously surrounded by open fields, has changed through the years and now includes busy roads and many homes. They are now indoor cats, safe from outdoor dangers and are very spoiled.

Another Tagawa mascot, China, came from a very special situation in 1998. China was a rambunctious, active and very vocal kitty who had a loud, very recognizable voice could be heard throughout the greenhouse, telling all of her exciting days at Tagawa. Due to China's propensity to roam the fields close to Tagawa's (which recently have been turned into home and townhomes), China went "on holiday" at one of our employees homes indoors.

Currently, Tagawa's have a new kitty, Miss Grey Kitty, who is a Siamese mix with beautiful blue eyes. She appeared in the parking lot out of nowhere during one of the many snow storms of December 2006. Having no luck finding her owners, Miss Grey Kitty was adopted into the Grey Kitty family. Because she is not a wanderer and enjoys being indoors, she greets visitors during the day and lives safely in the offices at night.

Grey Kitty's face smiling in the flowers adorns Tagawa Gardens' TV, newspaper and other advertising as well as their web site. His pawprints are on the back of the staff uniforms, and trail their way across letterhead and other correspondence. The Tagawa newsletter is appropriately called "*Tagawa Tails*." "Grey Kitty" is a registered trademark, and can be seen on products unique to Tagawa's — Grey Kitty® Purr-furred Container Gardens, Hanging Baskets, Geranium and Grey Kitty® Pawfurred Perennials to name a few. These products are grown on the premises and this tag ensures the quality of each item,

Grey Kitty is more than just a mascot and "advertising gimmick"— he is a community resource. *Cats with Gratitude™ Silent Auction Project* began in 2006 and so far has provided over \$9000 for community non-profits. Each qualifying non-profit group participating in *Cats with Gratitude™* receives a paper mache cat statue. An artist from the group decorates the cat, which is sold at a silent auction--all proceeds go directly to the groups that

created the statues. For 2008, *Cats with Gratitude™* will be held at Tagawa's *Holiday Gifts for Pets and Their People Craft Fair* event Nov. 8 & 9, and any non-profit animal group participating in this event may also participate in *Cats with Gratitude™*.

In honor of Grey Kitty, Tagawa Gardens sponsors a pet information/adoption event in July called *Grey Kitty® Birthday Party*. Visitors can enjoy information about many local, non-profit animal organizations and meet with cats, dogs, bunnies, guinea pigs, horses and other animals from nonprofit animal rescue groups, including Cat Care Society. There are classes about natural pet care and other animal topics and children of all ages can pet and learn about farm animals from an educational petting zoo inside the greenhouse. There is birthday cake and lemonade to celebrate the occasion.

A memorial garden is located on the premises near the front door of Tagawa Gardens, remembering the previous Grey Kitties and other mascots Jasper and J.J. Tagawa Gardens invites you to spend a few moments remembering them and your own special pets whose spirits are always alive in our hearts.

Among the many animal-loving Tagawa Gardens' employees, Michelle and Beth are volunteers and supporters of Cat Care Society, where Beth recently received the Golden Whisker Award for 10 years of service as a volunteer. Tagawa Gardens has been a supporter of Cat Care Society for over 15 years through donations of products and gift cards for fundraising events. Cat Care Society participates in Grey Kitty® Birthday Party by providing an information booth, volunteers and a special guest cat.

Tagawa Gardens' recommended Landscape Designer, Carole Kastler of Camelot Design, donated her professional services to provide the landscape plan required by the city for Cat Care Society's new building several years ago. 🐾
