She enjoys welcoming people to the shelter and says she wants to show people that this a home for cats, and not a cage. She regularly engages with people who are visiting the shelter and since she is so familiar with the cats here, she is able to describe their personalities to them.

Larry taught Paula the tricks of the trade. Paula still uses his formula for mixing up the canned food (or secret sauce as she likes to call it) to feed the cats. She takes great care when she feeds, spending time with the cats who need attention to eat and chopping up the food for the picky eaters.

Paula currently has 5 cats of her own, one of which she just adopted from Cat Care a just a few months ago. She has a fondness for long haired black cats and when Benny was surrendered after 10 years in a previous home, Paula fell in love. At the urging of her volunteer friends she adopted Benny and he immediately assimilated with her other cats, especially her other long haired black boy, Blackie. She has to put a special collar on Benny just to tell them apart!

Paula is a thrift store treasure hunter and finds many items that she then donates to the shelter. Paula is our treasure at the shelter. Her calm, friendly and reassuring nature and willingness to help with anything makes her truly a valuable volunteer. We could not without our wonderful Paula!

Where Are They Now? - Tales of Our CCS Alumni Cats

As this issue's "Where Are They Now?" story illustrates, there is almost nothing the Cat Care Society staff and volunteers won't do, in reaching out to cats in distress and trying to improve their lives. Their success stories which we're so proud to report here are made possible by the generous support of CCS donors—people like you, who love cats. Thanks to you, we've helped countless stray, neglected and mistreated cats—giving them a second chance at a life of quality in a loving home. Here's a new happy story, which actually began in the spring of 2016.

On their way to a fundraising event, three CCS employees noticed three cats on the side of a very busy road. The cats acted hungry, but they ran when they were approached. So the staff team went back to the shelter, returning with three humane traps; they set them with tuna, covered them with blankets and waited. Before long the cats were lured inside the traps.

We saved three cats from dire conditions that night. At least now they were safe indoors and could be seen by a CCS vet. Thinking quickly, the team assigned names to the cats based on the Littletonarea location where the rescues took place: Santa Fe, Union and Belleview.

Sadly, Belleview's infections and parasite infestation were so severe that we couldn't save him. We took some comfort in knowing that the beautiful brown tabby hadn't died in pain on the side of the road.

Union, another brown tabby, was truly feral; he wanted nothing to do with us. He crouched in the back of a kennel, never taking his eyes off the humans attending to him. Santa Fe was also hiding, scared as he was in his new confinement. "Who are all these people and what will they do to me?" he seemed to be asking.

Both Santa Fe and Union were neutered, vaccinated, dewormed and microchipped. Now, how would we integrate them into our shelter population? We placed them both in the Shy Cat Room with an attached "catio" – one of the outside patios accessible from several of our cat rooms – so they had safe outdoor access. We put CAUTION stickers on the door photos and bandannas on their collars.

Union just couldn't adjust; so he was moved back to our receiving area. Then,

working through our support network, we found him a barn home. (He ended up "relocating" himself to a neighboring barn, where he still lives.)



Meanwhile the staff allowed Santa Fe to transition out of the Shy Room, into the main hall with the general population—a risky move with a semi-feral stray cat. We watched closely for biting tendencies, and had anxious moments as Santa Fe darted and raced around. We had hidey beds and a large stress cage placed strategically around the hall.

Like most strays, homeless and feral cats, Santa Fe proved to be compatible with most of our other cats (it's people and confinement that they don't trust). He lived in our hall for two years, mellowing toward some CCS volunteers—who were able to pet and brush him!—and becoming fond of one special cat, a shy female named Peyton. He would sleep in front of her, as her protector. She was much more active than he was; while she played he was always napping nearby. He also had brief playtimes with Rollo, but Rollo was too rough for Santa Fe.

People would always say, "He's not available for adoption, right?" or, "No one will want him, he's too shy." He had a squinty eye and they would ask, "What's wrong with that cat?" To which we would reply, "Nothing!" Our staff doesn't give up on these cats. We knew that someone would fall in love with Santa Fe, and would give him all the time and space he needed to come further out of his shell.

And a few weeks ago, that's just what happened. A cat lover named Leslie had adopted two brothers, Turner and Flop, from us in 2016. We all remembered them. Now Turner had died, and Flop was lonely. Leslie thought Santa Fe would be the perfect companion for him.

Santa Fe settled quickly into his new room at Leslie's house. He didn't hide for long, and soon found his new "brother" Flop. They have shadowed each other ever since.

Two weeks after the adoption, we followed up with Leslie and received this report:

"Santa Fe's name is now Murphy, and he responds to it already. He seems very happy in his new house and he absolutely LOVES Flop! Flop was a little unsure of him at first, but he did accept him in the house right away. They sleep curled up together most of the time, they wash each other, they play together (at 4:00 in the morning!), and I think Flop is happy to have a brother again.... When Turner passed away unexpectedly from kidney stones, Flop and I were both heartbroken.... I think Murphy and Flop needed each other. Murphy is still a little skittish with me, but he does let me pet him a bit and he [gets] bolder each day..."

This is a happy-ending, second-chance story on several levels: a loving home away from the streets for Santa Fe, and the perfect barn home for Union; a new companion for Flop; and after the heartbreak of loss, a new cat for Leslie to love. These outcomes are the reason Cat Care Society works so hard at its mission: serving cats and the people who love them.

Of course, carrying out this mission costs money. There are so many more cats like Santa Fe, in need of safe shelter, state-of-the-art veterinary care, and adoption into a loving home. Since CCS receives no government funding, all of our financial support must come from the community—generous donors like you. Can you help

- \$50 buys blankets, cat toys and food dishes to equip one of our cat rooms for six months.



- 4) When you use up the money on the Gift Card, you just reload more. You may pay for reloading the card by cash, check, debit or credit card. (Note: Don't let your balance stay at zero for more than 30 days; you may need to buy a new card at CCS if your card remains inactive too long.)
