LETTER FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Now that 2023 is in our rearview, I am so humbled and excited to share our calendar-year stats and successes with you all. It was a busy year, with numbers up across the board. Even though we saw more cats in need than ever, we also adopted out more cats than ever, thanks to your support!

2023 By the Numbers

- Cats and kittens taken in: 1,244
- Cats in foster: 567 (339 kittens)
- Adopted: 1,098
- Average length of stay: 45 days
- Spays/neuters performed: 569
- Dental surgeries performed: 173
- Chronic medical conditions diagnosed/treated: 100+

In comparison, in 2022, Cat Care Society took in 860 cats and adopted 750.

Across the country, shelters saw an increase in pets in need. Economic conditions, inflation, lack of veterinary care and access, and the veterinary shortage, all affected the tough year that many organizations faced.

I think it's important to acknowledge that our statistics do not reflect the trend in every way. It's likely our specialty that makes us an anomaly. Because we care for so many special needs cats, and our status as a limited-admission shelter, we recognize how special it was to buck the larger trend. We also want to give a nod to the other shelters in our region who work just as hard as we do to save and adopt as many pets as possible.

Over the last year or two, we've shifted how we think about taking in new cats. It's easy to focus on the numbers, but it's just as important to think about the why behind them. For us, it's all about balance.

This balance has helped us increase our support of special needs cats, but we also know that CCS is more than that. No matter our niche, **we will always support all cats**. That includes young and healthy cats. Or cats who simply haven't found a home elsewhere.

Through it all, we balance our cat population against our resources; our staff size and budget must support our ability to care for the cats in our shelter. We're constantly evaluating how we can grow proportionately and are challenged to be thoughtful and strategic in everything we do. This level of control is one of the benefits of being a limited-admission shelter.

At the end of the day, remaining a safe place for cats who need help, and finding them loving homes, is always our top priority.







Sir Winston Winthrop

The sweetest senior tabby journeyed up from Colorado Springs to Cat Care Society last August. One of our shelter partners sent him our way since we were better equipped to handle his medical issues. Sir Winston Winthrop brought with him a FIV+ diagnosis, Feline Idiopathic Cystitis, stomatitis, anemia, periodontal disease, arthritis, a heart murmur and hyperglobulinemia. But immediate attention was needed on a painful mass on his face.

Not surprisingly, Sir Winston was a bit grumpy when he came in due to the discomfort and swelling on his cheek. Our team quickly removed the mass and got to work treating his other medical needs. At first, his prognosis was very guarded. Despite it all, he remained so loving, literally reaching out for affection from staff often.

Sir Winston went to a foster home for some TLC. By the second day, he was following his new humans around, never leaving their side and taking his medication like a champ. It was going so well in his foster home that Madison couldn't help but officially adopt him.

Now known as Winnie, Madison says you could never tell that he had any health issues. When he first went to their home, he would startle easily and wasn't very interested in toys. "He is a completely different cat now!" she said. "He loves to play with us and by himself. He greets us at the door and brings us his favorite toys to play with. We always say that there is no way he is 13, because he is as playful as a kitten."

Madison says they loved the experience fostering with Cat Care Society. "We did not have any prior experience with FIV kitties before Winnie, so we had no idea what to expect. FIV does not affect Winnie's day-to-day life or his loving personality!"

Meet Oozy

Oozy is a sweet soul who came to CCS last July. This tabby gal loves to cuddle and play with humans, and even does well with dogs and other cats. Oozy can be a bit shy and reserved at first, but is so loving and playful once she's adjusted to her environment. She has been making strides in her foster home and coming out of her shell.

She is diabetic, and takes her insulin very well! The CCS team would love to teach you how to give her medicine and send you home with a month's worth of insulin and food! And, thanks to a generous donor, Oozy's adoption fee has been sponsored!

Oozy is the purrfect girl to watch and be entertained by, and she would love to spend the day by your side. Don't let her diabetes discourage you; we promise she is worth it!

Foster Spotlight: Teresa Knaack

One of Cat Care Society's longest fosters, Teresa, has graciously offered up her home, time and talents to care for kitties in need since 2001, caring for over 300 cats and kittens in total!


Her passion for helping cats began as a small child when she helped her grandma take care of a colony of alley cats. When she saw CCS' cage-free environment, she knew this was the place to continue her work.

On a typical day, Teresa is woken up by kitten mayhem around 5 a.m. It begins by scooping litter, serving breakfast and cleaning up after the little ones. Throughout the day, she takes plenty of "kitten breaks" to unwind, get cuddles and rest her eyes from staring at a screen. In the evenings, there is lots of socialization, cuddles and play time.

Teresa says 3-week-old kittens are her absolute favorite. "They are ridiculously cute and wobbly."

Last year, she fostered 19 cats and kittens, 16 of which had tested positive for panleukopenia. This deadly virus is a serious health threat that takes a lot of support, time and care.

Teresa says that at first, she didn't think she would be able to give her foster cats back, but it does get easier. "I just remember that giving them back lets me help more cats," she said.

FIV & FeLV in Cats What You Need to Know

If you're considering adopting a cat with FIV or FeLV, or already own a cat with either condition, it's important to know what a diagnosis means for his or her life - and yours - and what to expect.

FIV vs. FeLV: An Overview

You may often hear the terms FIV (Feline Immunodeficiency Virus) and FeLV (Feline Leukemia Virus) together. This is because both are retroviruses, can weaken a cat's immune system, and are transmitted from cat to cat only (meaning humans and other pets are safe). However, FIV and FeLV are very different in terms of how they affect a cat's life.


FIV is an infectious virus similar to HIV in people — which is why you may hear it called Feline AIDS. It's estimated that about 3-5% of cats are FIV positive (FIV+).

And despite its name, FeLV is not actually a form of cancer or leukemia, but one of the most common feline infectious diseases in the world. Complications, however, can cause cancers like leukemia and lymphoma. FeLV is present in approx. 2-3% of cats in the U.S.

Whereas FIV used to be thought of as the "fighting disease" due to its transmission via deep bite wounds, FeLV has been known as the "love virus" due to its transmission through mutual grooming. It can also be passed through shared bowls or litter boxes, fighting, or from a mother cat to her kittens.

Treating FIV & FeLV

There is currently no cure or treatment for either virus. Instead, we aim to manage symptoms and offer supportive care to alleviate secondary complications caused by the viruses.

This is why prevention is so important. While there is no vaccine for FIV, there is for FeLV! Spaying and neutering your cats, and vaccinating FeLV-negative cats, is the best way to stop the spread.

A Diagnosed Cat's Outlook

FIV and FeLV used to be terrifying diagnoses. Many shelters used to euthanize cats who tested positive for either virus, believing that their quality of life and chances of adoption would be decreased. New research indicates that cats with FIV can actually live a relatively normal, full life. However, cats with FeLV do have shortened lifespans; on average, most FeLV+ cats live about 2-5 years after diagnosis.

Despite chances at a normal quality of life, because their immune system is compromised, cats with either condition are more susceptible to other illnesses and may not recover as quickly from infections or after surgery. It is recommended that these cats remain indoors only. And, to prevent spread, we recommend that FeLV cats be an only cat or live with other FeLV cats.

If you have other healthy cats and are considering adopting an FIV+ cat, we recommend you speak with your veterinarian first to discuss the risk factors for your specific situation. However, the general consensus is that FIV+ and non-FIV cats can live together as long as everyone is spayed or neutered, remains indoors and interacts peacefully.

Cats with FIV or FeLV — or other medical conditions - may often be overlooked, but we've seen that these same cats can be just as loving, playful and worthy of love as any other cat.
